# Overarching Issues

## RELATION TO EXISTING LEGISLATION AND REGULATIONS

- a. understanding role of government and forest company (e.g. rights; provincial plans)
- b. conflicts & redundancy with legislation

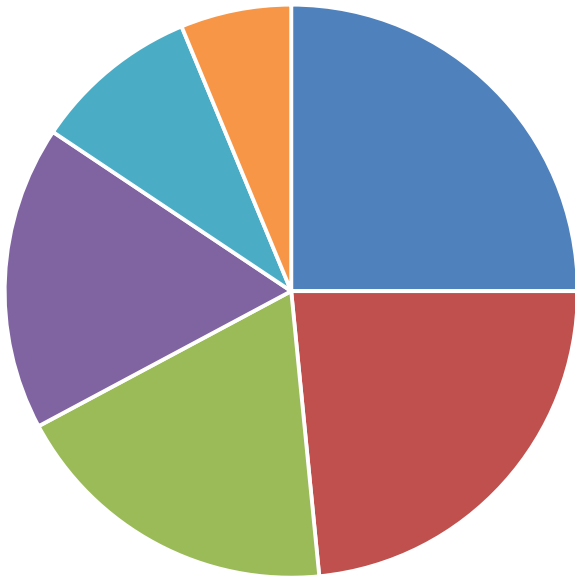
## ACHIEVABILITY OF INDICATORS

- a. company's ability to extend their sphere of influence (FPIC, Caribou)
- b. standard seen as onerous and not feasible
- c. standard seen as having redundancies

## CLARITY OF INDICATORS

- a. some requirements or terms in standard need greater clarity and more definitions (while some are seen as prescriptive)

Submissions by Region

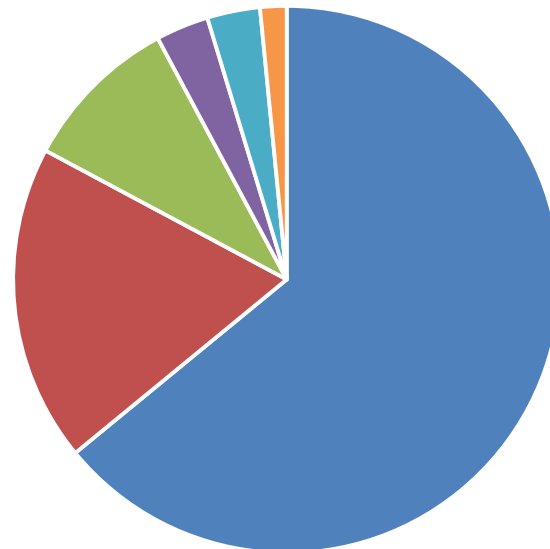

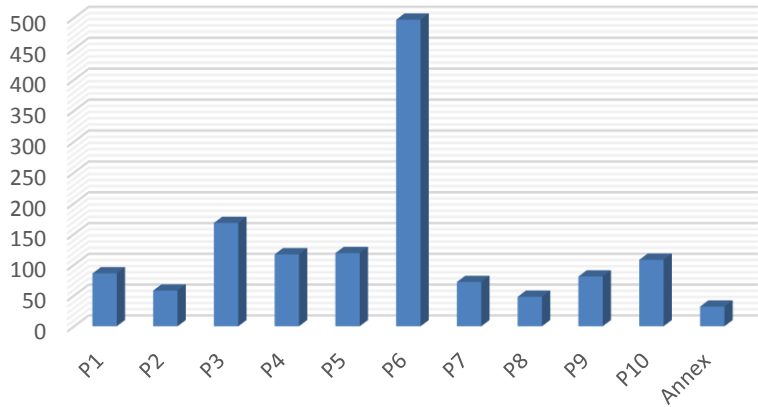

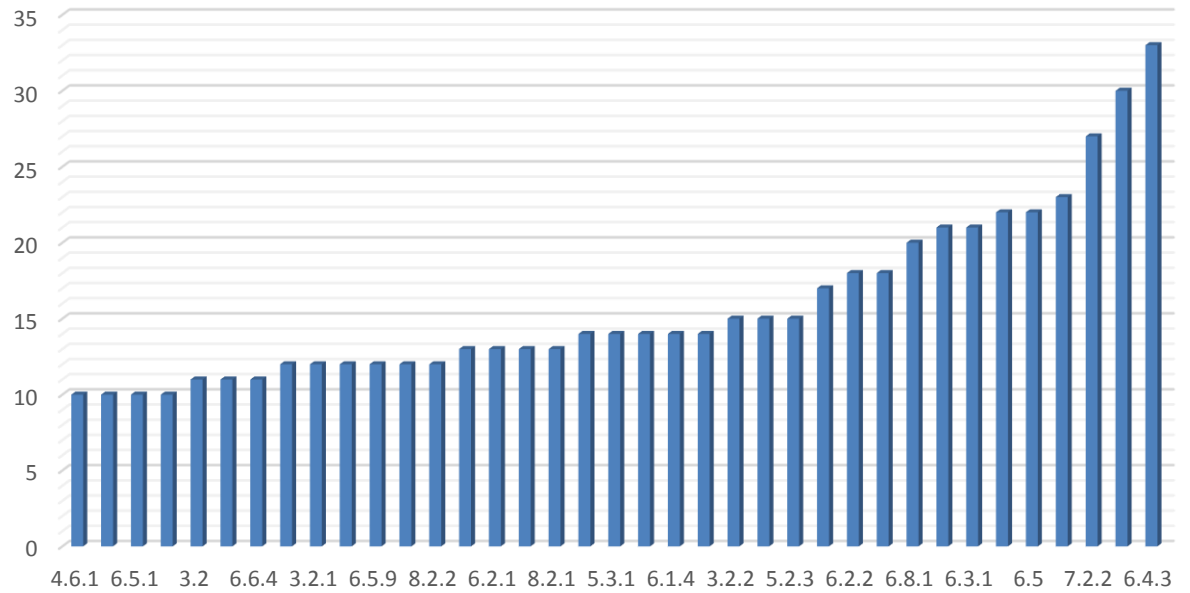

## Comments by Principle

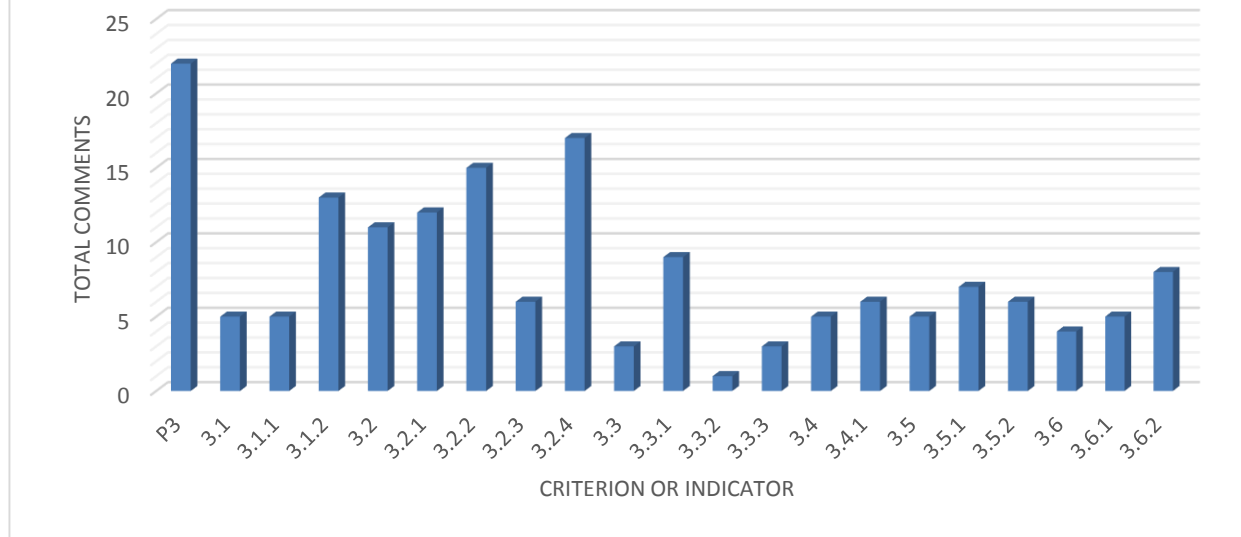


## Indicators with Greatest Number of Comments





## Principle 3: Total Comments by Indicator



1. Greater clarity is required on applying FPIC.
2. Willingness and ability of communities to engage
3. Agreement on what is included in FSC FPIC agreements and what is identified elsewhere.
4. Clarifying what does consent look like.

### **Actions**

- a. Support receiving input from Indigenous peoples on D1, FPIC guidance and ICL concepts (NAFA Forum)
- b. Scenario and field test
- c. FPIC Guidance.
- d. Continue working with P3 TEP and IFL-ICL subcommittee seeking direction
