Forestry overview

~ Pre-1970

Widespread, small-scale 'mom and pop' logging of large spruce and pine

~ early 1970s - 1992

*Start of larger scale forestry operations ~ 100 to 200,000 m³/yr
Softwood sawlogs and softwood pulplogs targeted for harvest*

1992 to Present

Full utilization of the timber resource both softwood and hardwood





in SK Forestry Sector






